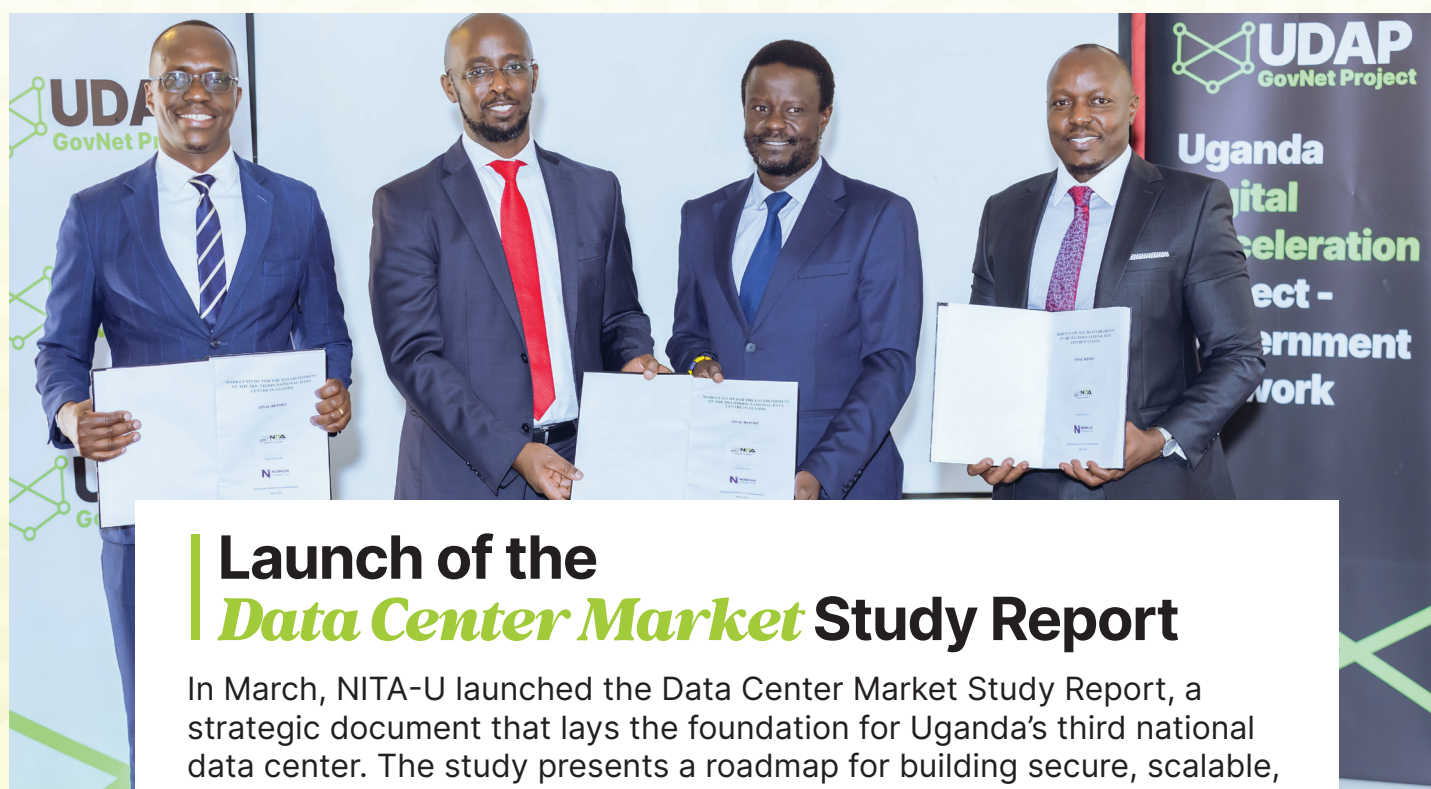
# Successful Completion of Regional Leadership Engagements under the Uganda Digital Acceleration Project

NITA-U has made significant progress under the Uganda Digital Acceleration Project (UDAP – GovNet), a World Bank- government funded initiative aimed at reducing digital inequalities across the country. The project continues to focus on expanding internet access, enhancing e-government services, and fostering digital skills in refugee-hosting and underserved communities.

Working alongside the Ministry of ICT & National Guidance and the Office of the Prime Minister, NITA-U concluded a five-region series of Regional Leadership Engagements across Arua, Hoima, Mbarara, Lamwo, and Adjumani. These sessions were instrumental in inducting local leaders as digital champions and aligning grassroots support for ICT infrastructure rollout and digital skilling under UDAP Govnet.



The project aims to **improve** internet access, e-government services, and digital skills in underserved and refugee-hosting communities.



## Launch of the *Data Center Market* Study Report

In March, NITA-U launched the Data Center Market Study Report, a strategic document that lays the foundation for Uganda's third national data center. The study presents a roadmap for building secure, scalable, AI-ready infrastructure that positions Uganda as a regional digital hub.



# NITA-U Engages Uganda Editors' Guild on UDAP-GovNet



NITA-U held an engaging media session with the Uganda Editors' Guild at Protea Hotel Kampala, bringing together editors from print, television, radio, and online platforms for an in-depth discussion on the Uganda Digital Acceleration Project (UDAP-GovNet).

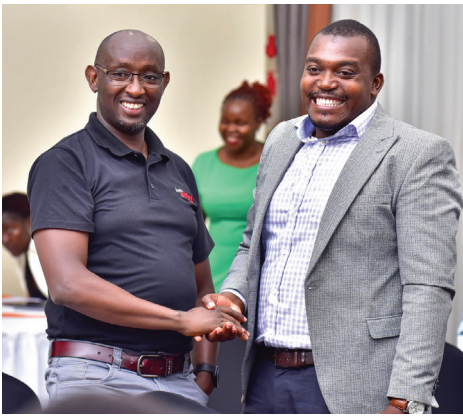
The dialogue provided a platform to reflect on Uganda's digital transformation journey and share key project updates and objectives, including:

- Expanding broadband connectivity to public institutions and underserved communities
- Enhancing e-government services for improved service delivery and efficiency
- Promoting digital inclusion, especially in refugee-hosting districts and vulnerable communities
- Strengthening digital skills and workforce readiness for Uganda's digital economy
- Improving e-waste management to support environmental sustainability

As the project moves into the implementation phase, NITA-U recognized the critical role of the media in shaping public discourse, enhancing transparency, and driving awareness of digital transformation efforts across the country.







## Strategic Research on Rural Connectivity

During the Stakeholder Validation Workshop in March, NITA-U presented findings from critical studies on rural broadband and last-mile Wi-Fi deployment. These insights will shape future connectivity models to ensure even the most remote communities are part of Uganda's digital journey.



## Leadership in Responsible AI at Africa AI Summit 2025

As a Strategic Technology Partner at the Africa Artificial Intelligence Summit 2025, NITA-U emphasized ethical, inclusive, and scalable AI adoption. Executive Director Dr. Hatwib Mugasa reaffirmed Uganda's commitment to responsible innovation, anchored by the ongoing development of the National AI Framework.



## Landmark MoU with Presight

In a major step toward smart governance, NITA-U signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Presight, a global AI and analytics firm. This partnership aims to **enhance Uganda's cybersecurity, cloud infrastructure, and digital public services** while promoting local innovation and job creation.



## Strengthening Uganda's Cyber Resilience

NITA-U conducted a week-long cybersecurity Training of Trainers program for over 50 UPDF personnel from across the country. This third edition of the training, delivered by NITA-U's Information Security experts, focused on practical, hands-on simulations aimed at strengthening institutional capacity to establish and scale Information Security Operations.

The initiative is part of NITA-U's ongoing efforts to enhance national cybersecurity awareness and support Uganda's journey toward a more resilient and digitally secure future.



## Supporting UGPass Onboarding

The Directorate of E-Government Services led UGPass onboarding across various government agencies. This effort is central to building an interoperable, secure digital identity framework that will streamline access to public services for all Ugandans.



## Contributing to industry conversations

NITA-U was honored to contribute to a series of high-level industry dialogues covering a wide spectrum of critical themes, including e-Governance, Artificial Intelligence, Information Security, Data Protection, and beyond. ## Infrastructure Development - Civil Works Kick Off in Kayunga Under NBI Phase 5

NITA-U has officially commenced civil works for Phase 5 of the National Backbone Infrastructure (NBI), beginning with the inspection of the Kayunga Transmission Station, one of 21 new sites under development.

Once completed, the station will relay high-speed data between Kampala and Jinja, serve as a regional hub, and regenerate signals over long distances.

Phase 5 will extend the fibre network by 5,845 km, adding to the existing 4,300 km. This expansion will significantly enhance internet access, bridge the digital divide, and unlock new opportunities in e-services, education, healthcare, and business across the country. The project represents a major step forward in strengthening Uganda's digital infrastructure, with implementation led by China International Telecommunications Construction Corporation (CITCC).

NITA-U is thrilled to have welcomed its 2025 Internship Cohort, a dynamic group of young minds eager to explore the world of ICT and digital transformation.

As part of their induction, the interns were taken on an insightful tour of key facilities, including the National Data Centre, Network Operations Centre, and the Computer Emergency Response Team
